### THE MANPOWER DEVELOPMENT AMENDMENT ACT, 1981

(Assented to , 1981)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1 The Manpower Development Act is amended by this Act.
- 2 Section 6 is amended by adding the following after subsection (1):
  - (1.1) Only persons who
    - (a) are Canadian citizens or have been lawfully admitted to Canada for permanent residence, and
    - (b) are residents of Alberta,

are eligible to be appointed as members of the Board pursuant to subsection (1)(a) and (d).

- 3 Section 7 is repealed and the following is substituted:
  - **7**(1) A member of the Board other than the Director
    - (a) holds office for a term not exceeding 3 years as prescribed in the appointment, and
    - (b) continues to hold office after the expiry of his term of office until he is reappointed, his successor is appointed or a period of 3 months has expired, whichever first occurs.
  - (2) A member of the Board appointed under section 6(1)(b) or (d) is eligible for reappointment for a 2nd term of office, but not for a further term of office until the expiration of a period of 3 years after his 2nd term has ended.

#### **Explanatory Notes**

- 1 This Bill will amend chapter 31 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1976.
- **2** Only a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant who is a resident of Alberta may be appointed as the chairman or a public member of the Alberta Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Board.

- **3** Section 7 presently reads:
  - 7(1) The term of office of each Board member shall be specified in the order for his appointment.
  - (2) The chairman
    - (a) shall be appointed for a term not exceeding five years, and
    - (b) may be re-appointed.
  - (3) Members appointed under section 6, subsection (1), clause (b) shall be appointed for a maximum of three years with terms of appointment so arranged that one member from each class shall be re-appointed or replaced each year.

- (3) An alternate member of the Board appointed under section 6(1)(c) is eligible
  - (a) to be reappointed as an alternate member under section 6(1)(c) for a 2nd term of office, or
  - (b) to be appointed as a member under section 6(1)(b) at any time.
- (4) The appointment of members pursuant to section 6(1)(b) shall be so arranged that 1 member from each class shall be reappointed or replaced each year.
- (5) The chairman of the Board
  - (a) holds office for a term not exceeding 5 years as prescribed in the appointment, and
  - (b) may be reappointed for further terms of office, each not exceeding 5 years.
- (6) If a person resigns his membership on the Board, his appointment as a member of the Board terminates on the effective date specified in his resignation or, if no effective date is specified, on the date of receipt of his resignation by the Board.
- (7) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may fill a vacancy on the Board by appointing a person to fill the unexpired term of office of the former member, and an appointment to an unexpired term shall not be considered, for the purposes of subsection (2),(3) or (5), as a term of office.
- 4 In the following provisions "Advisory" is struck out wherever it occurs and "Apprenticeship" is substituted:

section 11;
section 12;
section 13;
section 14;
section 27;
section 36;
section 37;
section 42;
section 45.
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In accordance with section 4(1) of The Interpretation Act. 1980, this Bill comes into force on the date it receives Royal Assent.

<sup>(4)</sup> No member representing employers or employees may serve for more than two terms.

<sup>(5)</sup> When for any reason a vacancy on the Board occurs, the Minister shall appoint another person to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of the member so replaced.

<sup>(6)</sup> Notwithstanding any vacancy, the Board may continue to function as though all positions were filled.

**<sup>4</sup>** The names of the Local Advisory Committee and the Provincial Advisory Committee are changed to Local Apprenticeship Committee and Provincial Apprenticeship Committee, respectively, to avoid a misinterpretation of the functions of those committees which include other than advisory matters.
