An Act to Incorporate the Calgary Young Women's Christian Association.

(Assented to 1910.)

WHEREAS the persons hereinafter named have by their petition prayed that an Act may be passed incorporating them under the name of the Calgary Young Women's Christian Association with power to hold real and personal property and with an exemption of the said property from taxation;

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition;

Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. Emily Kirby, Kate Underwood, Elizabeth Cushing, Lottie McCutcheon, Beatrie Stuart, Jennie Maclaren, Millie Mackay, Effie McWilliams, Margaret Terril, Mary Cook, Lizzie Budd, Lilly Hunt, Jennie Tony, Harriet Sayre, Ruby Chapin, Adele Lamont, Alice Staines, Jessie Glass, Alexandrina Clark, Alma Bennett, Maggie Bennett, Emma Griffiths, Mary Anderson, Mary Cushing, each of the City of Calgary in the Province of Alberta, and a married woman; Jessie Neilson, of the said City of Calgary, spinster; Alice Grigg, of the same place, widow; Annie Langford, of the same place, widow; Leta Morton, of the same place, widow; Martha Carter, of the same place, widow; and Clara Snyder, of the same place, widow, and such other persons as shall hereafter become members of the associa-Power is hold real (hristian Association" and shall have power to acquire and hold estate annual value real estate in the City of Calgary or any leasehold or any other interest therein provided the annual value of the real estate so acquired and not actually used for the work of the said association does not at any one time exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars, and the same, or any part thereof, to alienate, exchange, mortgage, lease or otherwise charge or dispose of as occasion may arise.

> 2. The object of the said corporation shall be to carry on the usual work of the Young Women's Christian Association consisting of the maintenance of a gymnasium, reading rooms and lecture rooms and the prosecution of such religious and social effort as will tend to promote the physical, intellectual, moral and spiritual development of the young women of the City of Calgary.

> 3. The first ten persons named in section 1 hereof shall constitute the first or provisional board of directors of the said association and shall hold office until their successors are elected in accordance with the by-laws, rules and regulations of the association.

> 4. The said corporation shall have power to pass by-laws, rules and regulations not inconsistent with this Act for the

government and conduct of the affairs of the corporation or of any branches thereof and may from time to time alter or rescind such by-laws, rules or regulations.

5. The said corporation may from time to time have or establish and maintain any number of branches thereof within the City of Calgary to promote the objects thereof.

6. The said corporation shall have power to establish a system of technical education, including such branches of science or such industrial arts as the officers of the said corporation may from time to time determine.

7. Every contract, agreement, engagement or bargain made and every bill of exchange drawn, accepted or endorsed, and cyery promissory note made or endorsed and every cheque made, drawn or endorsed on behalf of the said corporation by any agent, officer or servant of the corporation in general accordance with her powers as such under the by-laws of the corporation shall be binding upon the corporation and in no case shall it be necessary to have the seal of the corporation affixed to any such contract, agreement, or engagement, bargain, bill of exchange, promissory note or cheque, or to prove that the same was made, drawn, accepted or endorsed as the case may be in pursuance of any special by-law or special vote or order, nor shall the party so acting within her authority as agent, officer or servant of the corporation be thereby subjected individually to any liability whatsoever in respect thereof.

(2) Nothing in this section shall be construed to authorize the corporation to issue any note payable to the bearer thereof or any promissory note intended to be circulated as money or as the note of a bank.

8. All real and personal property of the said corporation within the City of Calgary is hereby declared to be exempt from all municipal or school taxes of every nature whatsoever.
