No. 13 of 1910 (Second Session).

An Act to Validate and Confirm certain Assessments and the Voters' List of the City of Wetaskiwin.

(Assented to 1910.)

WHEREAS the assessment made for the City of Wetaskiwin for the year 1910 has been declared invalid by the Judge of the District Court of the District of Wetaskiwin;

And whereas by reason thereof certain doubts have arisen as to the validity of the voters' list for the said City of Wetaskiwin for the said year;

And whereas the said city have proceeded to make a new assessment for the said year 1910;

And whereas certain doubts have arisen as to the validity of the assessments of the said city for the years 1906, 1907, 1908 and 1909;

And whereas the said City of Wetaskiwin has prayed by its petition that the said assessments and voters' list aforesaid be validated;

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition;

Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. That the new assessment of the City of Wetaskiwin for the year 1910 is hereby confirmed and declared legal, valid and binding, notwithstanding that the same may be made after the time mentioned in 7th Municipal Ordinance.

Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent any taxpayer of the said city from appealing from the amount of his or other assessments as provided in the said Municipal Ordinance.

2. That the voters' list prepared for the said city for the year 1910 shall be and be deemed to have been legal, valid and binding, notwithstanding the defects in the said assessment roll.

3. That each of the assessments of the said city for the years 1906, 1907, 1908 and 1909 are hereby declared valid, legal and binding and to have always been so, notwithstanding any defect therein contained.
