An Act to Incorporate Les Fils De Marie Immaculee.

Preamble

W HEREAS an association of ecclesiastics has existed for some time in the Town of St. Albert, in the Province of Albert, under the name of "Les Fils de Marie Immaculee," having for its object the establishment and carrying on of missions, the erection and conduct of schools, colleges, seminaries, churches, orphanages and hospitals;

And whereas the petition presented in their name prays that the said association may be vested with corporate powers and it is

expedient to grant their prayers;

Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Incorporation

1. The Reverend Jerome Boutin, Alfred Molle, Alexandre Roudard, and such other persons as are now or may hereafter become under the provisions of this Act members of the said association, shall be and are hereby declared to be a body politic corporate in deed and in name by the name of "Les Fils de Marie Immaculee" for the purpose and objects aforesaid.

The said corporation shall have perpetual succession and tracted with, including the borrowing of money on mortgage and promissory note, sue and be sued, implead or be impleaded in any matter whatsoever in all courts and places whatsoever in this province.

Acquisition and allenation times hereafter to acquire by gift, devise, bequest, transfer, pur chase, or otherwise for the benefit of the corporation any land or real or personal estate and the same or any part thereof may from time to time dispose of by sale, transfer or mortgage, lease, ex change or otherwise and with the proceeds therefrom may acquire other lands, tenements, hereditaments and other property (real or personal) or invest the same in any security whatsoever for the use of the corporation.

Head office

4. The head office of the corporation shall be at St. Albert, in the Province of Alberta, or at such other place in the province as may from time to time be determined by the by-laws of the conporation.

Branches

5. The corporation may from time to time establish and maintain any number of branches thereof to promote the objects of the corporation and for such purpose to appoint such subordinate officers with such powers and tenure of office as the corporation may deem advisable.

By-laws

6. It shall be lawful for the corporation to make by-laws, rules, orders and regulations for the government and proper administration of the property, affairs and interests of the said corporation and to repeal and amend the same from time to time.

Management

7. Until otherwise directed by by-law the present existing officers of the said corporation shall be officers with like powers and privileges of the said corporation and the present existing rules and regulations of the said association shall "mutatis mutandis" be the rules and regulations of the said corporation until changed by by-law.

Exercises of Industries

- 8. The said corporation may exercise any industry that may help them to maintain their institution and may bargain and sell the products of the same, provided they conform to the laws of the province.
- 9. The corporation shall at all times whenever required so to do by the Lieutenant Governor in Council, make a report in writing of their affairs and property.
- 10. Provided that the powers herein granted shall be subject to the general laws of the province now in force or hereafter enacted.
