AN ACT TO AMEND THE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT

(Assented to , 1983)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1 The Highway Traffic Act is amended by this Act.
- 2 Section 1 is amended by adding the following after clause (r.1):

(r.2) "seatbelt" means a mechanical device installed in a vehicle that is designed to restrain a driver or passenger in his seat during an emergency.

- 3 Section 8 is amended by adding the following after clause (g):
 - (g.1) prescribing the design and installation of seatbelts;

(g.2) exempting the drivers of prescribed classes of vehicles that are used for construction or agricultural purposes or that have to make frequent stops, from the operation of section 124.1.

4 The following is added after section 124:

124.1(1) Subject to the regulations, a person who drives a vehicle on a highway without every person in the vehicle being properly secured by a seatbelt that is installed and designed as prescribed by the regulations, is guilty of an offence.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) a person who is driving a vehicle may disconnect or release his seatbelt at any time that he is driving his vehicle in reverse.

(3) A person over the age of 16 years who is a passenger in a vehicle that is being driven on a highway and is not properly secured by a seatbelt that is installed and designed as prescribed by the regulations, is guilty of an offence.

5 This Act comes into force on January 1, 1984.
