AGRICULTURAL CHEMICALS AMENDMENT ACT, 1984

(Assented to , 1984)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1 The Agricultural Chemicals Act is amended by this Act.
- 2 Section 14 is amended by adding the following after subsection (2):
 - (2.1) A licence or permit may, whether at the time of issue, renewal or reinstatement of the licence or permit or subsequently, be made subject to such conditions as
 - (a) the Minister or his delegate under subsection (2) considers fit, and
 - (b) are stated on the licence or permit or notified to the licence or permit holder in writing.
 - (2.2) No person shall contravene the conditions of a licence or permit.
- 3 Section 25 is amended
 - (a) by renumbering it as section 25(1);
 - (b) in subsection (1)(a), by striking out "prescribing" and substituting "respecting or authorizing the setting of";
 - (c) by adding the following after subsection (1):
 - (2) Where a provision of regulations made under subsection (1) applies or is to apply only to particular agricultural chemicals or particular concentrations of agricultural chemicals, then the list in the regulations of agricultural chemicals or concentrations to which the provision applies may
 - (a) be made, or
 - (b) if made by the Lieutenant Governor in Council, be revoked, substituted or amended

by order of the Minister.

Explanatory Notes

- 1 This Bill will amend chapter A-6 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1980.
- 2 Conditions of a licence or permit.

- **3** Section 25(a) presently reads:
 - 25 The Lieutenant Governor in Council may make regulations
 - (a) prescribing the qualifications and conditions that must be met before a person may be licensed to apply or sell a pesticide or be eligible to receive a permit to apply an agricultural chemical in any open body of water;

(3) Regulations under subsection (1) may revoke, substitute or amend any list of agricultural chemicals or concentrations made under subsection (2).

In accordance with section 4(1) of the Interpretation Act, this Bill comes into force on the date it receives Royal Assent.
