### **APPROPRIATION (ALBERTA HERITAGE SAVINGS TRUST FUND, CAPITAL PROJECTS DIVISION) ACT, 1985-86**

#### **MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN:**

**Preamble** WHEREAS it appears by a Message from His Honour, Frank Lynch-Staunton, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Alberta, and the Estimates accompanying the Message, that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required during the fiscal year ending March 31, 1986 for the purpose of the making of investments pursuant to section 6(1)(a) of the *Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund Act* in projects which will provide long term economic or social benefits to the people of Alberta but which may not necessarily by their nature yield a return to the Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund:

MAY IT THEREFORE PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY that it be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, as follows:

**Appropriation for 1985-86** **1** From and out of the Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund, there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole \$252 354 100 for the period from April 1, 1985 to March 31, 1986 for the purpose of making investments in projects which will provide long term social and economic benefits to the people of Alberta but which may not necessarily by their nature yield a return to that Fund, as set forth in Schedule "A" to this Act.

**Accountability** **2** The due application of all money expended under this Act shall be accounted for.
