McDOUGALL FEMALE AND CHILD ABUSE CENTRE ACT

(Assented to , 1984)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Centre incorporated **1** There is hereby established a corporation to be known as the McDougall Female and Child Abuse Centre.

Objects

2 The objects of the Centre are to provide protection, counselling, services and residential accommodation for females and children who have suffered physical or emotional abuse.

3 The lands and buildings known as the Calgary McDougall School building, municipally described as 412 - 7 Street, S.W., Calgary, Alberta, and legally described as Plan A 1, Calgary Block 18, Lots 1 to 40 inclusive, and the whole of lane Block 18 shall be the premises of the Centre to be used for its services and administration, together with such other land as may be made available to it.

4(1) The Centre shall be administered by a Board consisting of 9 members, 1 of whom shall be chairman, appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council, and 1 of whom shall be a senior employee in the Department of Social Services and Community Health.

(2) The Board may make by-laws establishing its own procedures, and providing for the operation of the Centre.

Funding; accounting

Commencement

5(1) The Board shall administer such funds as it may receive by appropriation by the Legislature, by other grant of public money or by gift or bequest and shall render an annual audited account of its operations and finances to the Minister of Social Services and Community Health.

(2) The Auditor General is the auditor of the Centre.

6 This Act comes into force on Proclamation which shall not precede the effective date of the first appropriation of funds by the Legislature, to the purposes of the Centre.
