#### STUDENT EMPLOYMENT TAX CREDIT ACT

(Assented to

, 1984)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1 The Alberta Income Tax Act is amended by this Act.
- 2 The following is added after section 10:
  - 10.1(1) In this section "student" means an individual
    - (a) who is 16 years of age or more;
    - (b) who has not attained the age of 25 years; and
    - (c) who has been enrolled in a full or part time education program within the previous 12 months at a school or post-secondary institution.
  - (2) This section applies to the 1984 taxation year only.
  - (3) An individual, who
    - (a) resided in Alberta on the last day of the taxation year,
    - (b) employed a student during the taxation year, and
    - (c) has not claimed, received or benefitted from any grant, subsidy, loan or rebate as a result of the provision of employment in Alberta, in respect of the 1984 taxation year from the Government of the Province or of Canada

is entitled to a student employment credit for that taxation year in accordance with this section and the regulations made

## **Explanatory Notes**

- 1 This Bill will amend chapter A-31 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1980.
- 2 Provides for a tax credit of half of the wages paid to students, up to \$1000.

- (4) A student employment credit for the 1984 taxation year shall be an amount equal to the lesser of
  - (a) half of the aggregate of all wages in respect of employment in Alberta, paid by the individual to 1 or more students during the taxation year, and
  - (b) \$1000.
- (5) This section does not apply to an individual employing a student who is his spouse, child, brother or sister.
- (6) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may make regulations defining any expression in this section that is not defined therein.
- 3 This Act comes into force on December 1, 1984.
