#### DAVID MICHAEL SKAKUN ADOPTION TERMINATION ACT

(Assented to , 1985)

WHEREAS by Order of His Honour Judge R.P. Kerans, in the District Court of Northern Alberta, Judicial District of Edmonton, it was ordered that David Skakun, be declared to be, from the 28th day of October, 1971, the adopted child of Ralph Edwin Livermore and Myrtle Louise Marie Livermore, and be given the surname of Livermore; and

WHEREAS the said order of adoption can no longer be appealed against by reason of the lapse of time, and Myrtle Louise Marie Livermore, Ralph Edwin Livermore, Michael Skakun and Johanna Kuka Borysko, have indicated their consent to the adoption being terminated; and

WHEREAS David Michael Livermore applied for and was granted a change of name to David Michael Skakun pursuant to the *The Change of Name Act* (Saskatchewan) on January 20, 1984; and

WHEREAS the Petitioner has by his petition prayed that it be enacted as herein after set forth and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the petition;

THEREFORE HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Adoption order terminated 1 The order dated the 27th day of October, 1971, and entered on the 28th day of October, 1971, whereby David Michael Skakun was declared to be the adopted child of Ralph Edwin Livermore and Myrtle Louise Marie Livermore and to be named David Michael Livermore is hereby terminated.

Termination of kinship

2 David Michael Skakun is hereby declared not to be the lawful child and heir of either Ralph Edwin Livermore or Myrtle Louise Marie Livermore, and not to have any rights of inheritance from Ralph Edwin Livermore or Myrtle Louise Marie Livermore that might otherwise devolve on him by law.

In accordance with section 4(1) of the Interpretation Act, this Bill comes into force on the date it receives Royal Assent.
