#### LE DIOCESE DE ST. PAUL AMENDMENT ACT, 1985

(Assented to , 1985)

WHEREAS Le Diocese de St. Paul was incorporated by An Act to Incorporate the Roman Catholic Bishop of the Diocese of Saint-Paul, and the Roman Catholic Parishes and Missions in the Diocese of Saint-Paul, being chapter 118 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1949(1); and

WHEREAS a petition has been presented praying that it be enacted as herein set forth and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the petition;

THEREFORE HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- I An Act to Incorporate the Roman Catholic Bishop of the Diocese of Saint-Paul, and the Roman Catholic Parishes and Missions in the Diocese of Saint-Paul is amended by this Act.
- 2 The following is added after section 8:
  - **9** Notwithstanding section 8, the land in the County of St. Paul, owned by Le Diocese de St. Paul, and described as follows:

Lot 1, Plan 812 1999, containing 4.05 Hectares (10.00 Acres) more or less. (S.E. 9-58-8-W4th)

EXCEPTING THEREOUT ALL MINES AND MINERALS

together with all improvements thereon, shall be exempt from assessment and municipal taxation with effect from January 1, 1985, for so long as the lands are registered in the name of Le Diocese de St. Paul and used for the provision of recreational, social, cultural, educational, religious and charitable facilities to the general public on a non-profit basis.

# **Explanatory Notes**

- 1 This Bill will amend chapter 118 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1949(1).
- ${\bf 2}$  New section 9 provides for exemption from municipal taxes. New section 10 provides for a short title to the Act.

10 This Act may be cited as Le Diocese de St. Paul Act.

In accordance with section 4(1) of the Interpretation Act, this Bill comes into force on the date it receives Royal Assent.
