CHIROPRACTIC PROFESSION AMENDMENT ACT, 1986

(Assented to _____, 1986)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1 *The Chiropractic Profession Act, SA 1984 cC-9.1, is amended by this Act.*

2 *Section 1(d) is amended by striking out “and includes the use of x-ray and such other analytical instruments, therapies and diagnostic procedures as may be prescribed in the regulations”.*

3 *The following is added after section 2:*

2.1(1) No person shall be approved for registration under this Act if, at the date of the application for registration, he practises naturopathy

(a) as a member of an association that has as one of its objects the licensing of persons to practise naturopathy,

(b) pursuant to regulations made under the *Health Disciplines Act*, or

(c) as an individual who is neither a member of an association described in clause (a) nor a member of a designated health discipline under the *Health Disciplines Act*.

(2) No person who is registered under this Act as a registered member or registered practitioner, as the case may be, shall practise naturopathy.

4 *Section 5 is amended by adding “2.1,” after “2(1).”*

Explanatory Notes

1 This Bill will amend chapter C-9.1 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1984.

2 Section 1(d) presently reads:

1 In this Act,

(d) "chiropractic" means the branch of the healing arts concerned with the restoration and maintenance of human health by the chiropractic adjustment or manipulation of the spinal column and other articulations of the body and includes the use of x-ray and such other analytical instruments, therapies and diagnostic procedures as may be prescribed in the regulations;

3 Prohibition against dual registration.

4 Section 5 presently reads:

5 The Court of Queen's Bench, on application by the Council by way of originating notice, may grant an injunction enjoining any person from doing any act that contravenes section 2(1), 4 or 77, notwithstanding any penalty that may be provided by this Act in respect of that contravention.

5 *Section 75(1)(e) is repealed.*

5 Section 75(1) presently reads in part:

75(1) The Council may make regulations

(e) prescribing analytical instruments, therapies and diagnostic procedures which may be utilized in the practice of chiropractic;
