- (c) advise the Government on the objectives of a science and technology development policy;
- (d) carry out any other activity that the Premier or the Minister considers appropriate.
- (2) The Council in carrying out its activities under subsection (1) may
 - (a) solicit information and opinions respecting matters set out in subsection (1) from persons and organizations not represented by members of the Council,
 - (b) study matters relevant to the development of science and technology, and
 - (c) appoint subcommittees consisting of both members and other persons who are not members of the Council.

Members of Council

- **4**(1) The Council shall consist of the Premier, the Minister and not more than 28 other members appointed in accordance with this section.
- (2) The Premier shall chair the Council.
- (3) The Minister is a vice-chair of the Council.
- (4) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint not more than 28 other members to the Council.
- (5) Not more than 3 of the members of the Council appointed under subsection (4) may be Members of the Legislative Assembly.
- (6) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint as vice-chair of the Council in addition to the Minister one of the members appointed under subsection (4) who is not a Member of the Legislative Assembly.
- (7) A member of the Council appointed under subsection (4) holds office for a term of not more than 3 years as prescribed in the appointment.
- (8) The members of the Council may be paid remuneration and their reasonable travelling, living and other expenses incurred in the course of their duties as members at a rate prescribed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

(9) A member of the Council continues to hold office after the expiry of the member's term of office until the member is reappointed, a successor is appointed or a period of 3 months has expired, whichever occurs first.

Staff

5 In accordance with the *Public Service Act*, there may be appointed the employees required to conduct the business of the Council.

Meetings

- **6**(1) The Council shall meet at least twice in each fiscal year.
- (2) A quorum of the Council consists of 10 of the members appointed under section 4(4).

Expiry

7 This Act expires on March 31, 1994 unless it is continued for a further period by an order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council.
