NECHI COMMUNITY COLLEGE ACT

(Assented to , 1990)

WHEREAS the Nechi Institute On Alcohol And Drug Education was incorporated on October 15, 1974 pursuant to the Societies Act; and

WHEREAS the Institute is operating a community worker training centre near the City of Edmonton under the name of the Nechi Institute; and

WHEREAS a petition has been presented praying that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the petition;

THEREFORE HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

Definitions

Preamble

In this Act,

(a) "Board" means the Board of Directors of the Nechi Community College;

(b) "by-laws" means the by-laws of the Nechi Community College;

(c) "College" means Nechi Community College incorporated by section 2;

(d) "property" includes real and personal property;

(e) "teaching staff" includes the professors, associate professors, lecturers, instructors and all others engaged in the

By-laws; procedure 7 The Board shall by law prescribe the terms of office and method of election, appointment, replacement and retirement of members of the Board and the procedure to be followed by the Board, subject to the provisions of this Act.

Voting 8 Each member of the Board shall have one vote except the member acting as chairman of a meeting of the Board who shall cast a vote only if there is otherwise a tied vote on a resolution.

Powers of Board 9 The conduct, management and control of the College and its property, revenues, business and affairs are vested in the Board and the Board has all the powers necessary or convenient to perform its duties and achieve the objects and purposes of the College, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the power:

> (a) to appoint and to remove and to fix the number, duties and other benefits of officers, teaching and administrative staff and other employees, servants or agents;

> (b) to make rules governing the educational policy, the admission of students, the curriculum, the issuing of diplomas and certificates to graduates, and any other matters whatsoever in connection with the operation of the College;

> (c) to make such by-laws and orders as are deemed necessary for the management of the affairs of the College and from time to time to amend, alter or repeal the by-laws and orders, or any of them, as the Board deems fit and proper;

> (d) to make such by-laws respecting the number of the members of the Board, the election or appointment of the members of the Board and of the officers of the Board and their respective rights, powers, privileges and duties and the suspension and removal of members of the Board;

> (e) to appoint a President of the College and professors, lecturers, instructors and other officers to the service of the College on such terms and conditions as the Board may deem fit and to terminate such an appointment at such time or times as the Board may deem fit;

(f) to appoint and remove an auditor of the College.

10(1) Subject to subsection (3), the funds of the College shall be applied to the achievement of its objects.

(2) The funds of the College not immediately required for its purposes and the proceeds of all property that come into the

hands of the Board, subject to any trust or trust affecting same, may be invested and reinvested in such investments as the Board deems advisable.

(3) If upon the winding up or dissolution of the College there remains, after satisfaction of all its debts, liabilities and obligations, any property or assets whatsoever, the same shall not be paid or distributed generally among the members, but shall be paid or transferred to such other charitable organization in Canada, the objects of which, in the opinion of the Board, most resemble those of the College.

(4) No member of the College or of the Board shall be entitled to receive any of the funds or assets of the College except in respect of remuneration for services to the College or remuneration of expenses incurred in the fulfilment of duties, in the amount and manner approved by the Board.

- Head office 11 The head office of the College shall be located in Alberta in a place specified in the by-laws.
- President 12 The President shall generally supervise and direct the academic work of the College, teaching and administrative tasks, staff and the officers and servants; and shall be an advisor to the Board and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as are assigned by the Board.
- Accounting 13 The College shall at all times when called upon to do so, render an account in writing of its property and affairs to the Lieutenant Governor in Council.
- General laws 14 The powers herein granted shall be subject to the general laws now or hereafter in force in the Province of Alberta.
