MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN:

Preamble

WHEREAS it appears by a Message from His Honour, Gordon Towers, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Alberta, and the Estimates accompanying the Message, that the sum hereinafter mentioned is required during the fiscal year ending March 31, 1995 for the purpose of making investments pursuant to section 6(1)(a) of the *Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund Act* in projects which will provide long term economic or social benefits to the people of Alberta but which may not necessarily by their nature yield a return to the Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund:

MAY IT THEREFORE PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY that it be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, as follows:

Appropriation  
for 1994-95

**1** From and out of the Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund, there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole \$50 612 000 for the period from April 1, 1994 to March 31, 1995, for the purpose of making investments in projects which will provide long term economic or social benefits to the people of Alberta but which may not necessarily by their nature yield a return to that Fund, as set forth in the Schedule, including the amount of \$30 011 000 voted by section 1 of the *Appropriation (Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund, Capital Projects Division) Interim Supply Act, 1994*.

Accountability

**2** The due application of all money expended under this Act shall be accounted for.
