TEACHING PROFESSION AMENDMENT ACT, 1995

(Assented to , 1995)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1 The Teaching Profession Act is amended by this Act.
- 2 Section 1 is amended by adding the following after clause (j):
 - (k) "certificate of qualification" means a certificate of qualification as a teacher issued under the School Act.
- 3 Section 5 is repealed and the following is substituted:

5 Subject to this section, the employment of a teacher by a school board, other than as a superintendent, is conditional on

- (a) the teacher being and continuing to be an active member of the association, or
- (b) the teacher holding a valid certificate of qualification.

Explanatory Notes

1 Amends chapter T-3 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1980.

3 Section 5 presently reads:

5(1) Subject to this section the employment of a teacher by a school board, other than as a superintendent, is conditional on the teacher being and continuing to be an active member of the association.

(2) When a school board employs a teacher, other than as a superintendent, the board shall notify the association in writing of the name of the teacher, the date of commencement of employment and the amount of salary to be paid and, notwithstanding subsection (1), the employment of the teacher by the school board is valid until the association notifies the school board in writing that the teacher is not an active member.

(3) When a teacher who is employed by a school board, other than as a superintendent, ceases to be an active member, the board may

continue to employ the teacher until the association notifies the board in writing that the teacher is not an active member.

4 Section 16(1) presently reads:

16(1) An investigation may be made with respect to the professional or ethical conduct of any active member but no disciplinary action shall be taken against a member unless a hearing has been held by the discipline committee.
