## APPROPRIATION (SUPPLEMENTARY SUPPLY) ACT, 1999

(Assented to 1999)

#### MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN:

#### Preamble

WHEREAS it appears by a Message from His Honour H. A. "Bud" Olson, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Alberta, and the Supplementary Estimates accompanying the Message, that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain charges and expenses of the Legislative Assembly and the Public Service of Alberta, not otherwise provided for during the fiscal year ending March 31, 1999 and for other purposes relating thereto:

MAY IT THEREFORE PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY that it be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, as follows:

### Operating expense

- 1(1) From the General Revenue Fund, there may be paid and applied a sum of \$256 000 towards defraying the further charges and expenses of the Legislative Assembly classed as operating expense for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1999, not otherwise provided for, as shown in the Schedule.
- (2) From the General Revenue Fund, there may be paid and applied a sum of \$82 154 000 towards defraying the further charges and expenses of the Public Service classed as operating expense for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1999, not otherwise provided for, as shown in the Schedule.

### Capital investment

2 From the General Revenue Fund, there may be paid and applied a sum of \$18 700 000 towards defraying the further charges and expenses of the Public Service classed as capital investment for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1999, not otherwise provided for, as shown in the Schedule.

Lottery Fund Payments 3 From the Lottery Fund, there may be paid and applied a su \$1 000 000 towards defraying the further charges and expens the Public Service classed as Lottery Fund Payments for the 1 year ending March 31, 1999, not otherwise provided for, as sl in the Schedule.

**Transfers** 

- **4(1)** The sum of \$40 000 in the Operating Expense vote o Office of the Chief Electoral Officer is transferred to the Ca Investment vote of the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer.
- (2) The sum of \$7 300 000 in the Capital Investment vote o Department of Family and Social Services is transferred to Operating Expense vote of the Department of Family and Services.
- (3) The sum of \$798 000 in the Operating Expense vote of Department of Municipal Affairs is transferred to the Ca Investment vote of the Department of Municipal Affairs.
- (4) The sum of \$800 000 in the Operating Expense vote of Department of Public Works, Supply and Services is transferred the Capital Investment vote of the Department of Public Works Supply and Services.

Achievement bonus transfers

- **5(1)** The Minister of Advanced Education and Ca Development may transfer part of the Operating Expense administered by this Minister to the Operating Expense administered by any other Minister for the purpose referred subsection (2).
- (2) An amount transferred under this section shall only expended on the Achievement Bonus program, as identified approved by the Minister of Advanced Education and Ca Development.
- (3) An amount transferred under subsection (1) is deemed n be included in the vote from which it is transferred; it is added and deemed to be part of the Operating Expense vote to which transferred.

Accountability

**6** The due application of all money expended under this Act be accounted for.
