#### CHILDHOOD COMPREHENSIVE EYE EXAMINATION ACT

(Assented to , 2015)

#### Preamble

WHEREAS children are Alberta's most important resource;

WHEREAS the Legislative Assembly is committed to ensuring that each child has the opportunity to learn in school to his or her full potential;

WHEREAS good vision is a vital component in the learning process; and

WHEREAS the assessment of a child's vision is an important step towards ensuring their full participation in the education system;

THEREFORE HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, enacts as follows:

#### **Definitions**

- **1(1)** In this Act,
  - (a) "comprehensive eye examination" means a comprehensive eye examination as specified by the Minister of Health for the purposes of this Act and performed by an optometrist or ophthalmologist;
  - (b) "Minister" means the Minister determined under section 16 of the *Government Organization Act* as the Minister responsible for this Act;

- (c) "ophthalmologist" means a regulated member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta who is authorized to use the title ophthalmologist;
- (d) "optometrist" means a regulated member of the Alberta College of Optometrists.
- (2) Any other term or expression used in this Act that is not defined in this Act has the same meaning as may be assigned to it in the *Education Act*.

#### Comprehensive eye examinations

- **2(1)** Every child entering grade 1 must undergo a comprehensive eye examination prior to the commencement of the school year.
- (2) A parent or guardian must provide to the school which his or her child attends a form signed by an optometrist or ophthalmologist indicating that the child has received a comprehensive eye examination.
- (3) A comprehensive eye examination performed for the purposes of this section must not have occurred more than one year prior to the submission of the form under subsection (2).
- (4) When a student is enrolling in a school after grade 1 and has not previously attended a school in Alberta, a parent or guardian must comply with subsection (2) as if the student was entering grade 1.
- (5) Registration for a child entering grade 1 or to which subsection (4) applies, is not complete until the form required under subsection (2) is provided to the school which the child attends.
- **(6)** For greater clarity, no child shall be prevented from attending school pursuant to subsection (5) if the form required under subsections (2) and (4) has not been completed.
- (7) No optometrist or ophthalmologist shall levy a charge for completion of any form required by this Act.

## Regulations

- **3(1)** The Minister may make regulations
  - (a) concerning the content of comprehensive eye examinations and all related matters;
  - (b) prescribing any forms required under this Act;

- (c) setting conditions and standards for comprehensive eye examinations for children who transfer to a school in Alberta from another jurisdiction;
- (d) concerning any additional matter or thing that is necessary in furtherance of this Act.
- (2) Prior to making a regulation under subsection (1) the Minister must consult with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta and the Alberta College of Optometrists about the proposed regulation.

## **Application**

**4** This Act applies to the 2016-17 school year and subsequent school years.

## **Coming into force**

**5** This Act comes into force on January 1, 2016.
