# BILL

#### No. 20 of 1916.

An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Sums of Money for the Public Service of the Fiscal Years ending respectively the Thirty-first day of December, 1915, and the Thirty-first day of December, 1916, and for the Three Months ending the Thirty-first day of March, 1917.

(Assented to , 1916.)

#### Most Gracious Sovereign:

WHEREAS it appears by Messages from His Honour Robert George Brett, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Alberta, and the Estimates accompanying the said Messages, that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of Alberta not otherwise provided for during the financial periods ending respectively the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and for other purposes relating thereto: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Appropriation Act, 1916."

2. From and out of the General Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole three hundred and eighty-three thousand nine hundred and forty-seven dollars and eighty cents towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen not otherwise provided for and set forth in schedule A to this Act.

**3.** From and out of the General Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole seven million five hundred and eight thousand six hundred and thirty-five dollars and no cents towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixteen not otherwise provided for and set forth in schedule B to this Act.

4. From and out of the General Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole one million eight hundred and eighteen thousand and forty-five dollars, and no cents towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, not otherwise provided for, and set forth in schedule C to this Act.

5. The due application of all moneys expended under this Act shall be accounted for.
