HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

The Vital Statistics Act, being chapter 22 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1916, is amended as follows:

1. Section 2, subsections 1 and 2: By striking out the word "Agriculture" where it appears in each of these subsections, and substituting in lieu thereof the word "Health".

2. By striking out the whole of section 5, and substituting

in lieu thereof the following:

"5. The Province of Alberta shall be divided into registration districts. Every school district shall be a registration district. As to the portion of the province in which there are no school districts, the same may be divided into registration districts, or any portion of the same may be attached to a school district and form a part of such registration district.

"(2) (a) Except as to a district in which a city is the whole or part of the district, and as to districts other than school districts, the secretary, or secretary-treasurer of the school district shall be the district registrar of that district.

- "(b) In any school district where a city is the whole or a part of the district, and in any district other than a school district, the Registrar-General shall appoint the district registrar."
- 3. Section 22: By striking out the words "district registrar within fifteen days" and substituting in lieu thereof the words "Registrar General within three days", and by striking out all the words after the words "Registrar-General" where they occur for the second time therein.
- 4. Section 44: By striking out the words "one dollar" and substituting in lieu thereof the words "five dollars".
