An Act to amend The Extra-Judicial Seizures Act.

(Assented to , 1923.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Extra-Judicial Seizures Act Amendment Act, 1923."

2. The Extra-Judicial Seizures Act, being chapter 96 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended by adding as section 9 thereof the following:

by adding as section 9 thereof the following: " $\mathfrak{9}$.—(1) Any notice of any application to the Court which is required to be served or given under any provision of this Act may, unless it is otherwise ordered by the Court or a judge, be served by registered mail, and shall be deemed to have been duly served upon proof being made by affidavit stating that such notice was sent by registered mail in a prepaid envelope addressed to the person to be served at his last known post office address, and also stating the date and place of mailing of such registered letter, and the date at which such registered letter would, in the ordinary course of mail, reach its destination. Such last mentioned date shall be deemed to be the date of service of such notice.

"(2) Every application to a Court or judge in respect of any extra-judicial seizure required to be made under this Act, shall be made to a Court or judge in the judicial district in which the goods the subject matter of the application are then situate."
