

A BILL TO AMEND THE CHIROPRACTIC ACT.

NOTE.

This Bill provides for interim licenses permitting chiropractors being holders of diplomas issued by a recognized school of Chiropractic, and otherwise qualified to present themselves for examination, to practise for a limited period prior to passing the examination provided for chiropractors who are not practising in the Province at the date of *The Chiropractic Act*.

An Act to amend The Chiropractic Act.

(Assented to _____, 1925.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Chiropractic Act Amendment Act, 1925.*"

2. Section 5 of *The Chiropractic Act*, being chapter 58 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1923, is amended by adding as subsections (2) and (3) thereof, the following:

“(2) The board may grant any person an interim license entitling him to practise as a chiropractor upon proof that such person is entitled to submit himself for examination under the provisions of section 8 hereof at the next examination held thereunder (and that he resides or will reside and practise during the currency of his license at a place not less than twenty miles from any chiropractor registered under the provisions of this Act.)

"(3) Any interim license granted under the provisions of this section shall terminate upon the date named therein and in any event shall only remain in force until the first day of July after the date thereof, but such license may be renewed from time to time."
