An Act respecting the Provincial Status of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

(Assented to _____, 1928.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Provincial Police Act, 1928.*"

2. Where in any Act (except in sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 of *The Alberta Police Act*, and in *The Police Pension Act, 1921*), or in any regulation made pursuant to any Act except only as aforesaid, reference is made to the Alberta Provincial Police, every such reference shall be deemed to be made to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and where in any such Act or regulation, except only as aforesaid, reference is made to the Commissioner of the Alberta Provincial Police, such reference shall be deemed to be made to a Superintendent of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

3. All members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, within the Province of Alberta, shall have, exercise and enjoy all the powers, duties, rights and privileges which are conferred upon them or any of them by *The Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act* of the Parliament of Canada as fully and effectually as if the said Act had been enacted by the Legislature of the Province.

4. The Lieutenant Governor in Council may from time to time declare that any reference in any Act to a constable or peace officer shall be deemed to refer to any member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and thereupon such Act shall be construed as if such member had been mentioned in such Act.

5. This Act shall come into force upon proclamation by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.
