An Act to amend The Restaurant Act.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Restaurant Act Amendment Act, 1930."
- 2. The Restaurant Act, being chapter 228 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is amended as to section 15, paragraph (c), by adding after the words "The Opium and Drug Act" the words "or The Lord's Day Act."
- 3. Section 16 of the said Act is amended as to paragraph (b) thereof, by adding after the words "The Opium and Drug Act" the words "or The Lord's Day Act."
- 4. Section 18 of the said Act is hereby struck out and
- the following substituted therefor:

  "18.—(1) Every person who conducts or carries on a restaurant in premises with respect to which he does not hold a subsisting licence, shall be liable upon summary conviction for a first offence to a fine of not less than twentyfive dollars nor more than one hundred dollars and costs, and for a second offence to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars and not more than two hundred and fifty dollars, and for a third offence to a fine of five hundred dollars, with or without imprisonment and with or without hard labour.
- "(2) Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Act, shall, if no other penalty is herein provided, be liable upon summary conviction to a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars and costs, and not more than one hundred dollars and costs."
