An Act to Incorporate Al Azhar Temple Crippled Children's Hospital.

(Assented to _____, 1932.)

WHEREAS a Petition has been presented praying that the petitioners and such others as may become associated with them under the provisions of this Act may be incorporated and vested with corporate powers, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of such petition;

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. Fred E. Spooner, manager; William D. King, bank manager; Morley C. Salmon, physician; Joseph V. Follett, physician; John N. Gunn, physician; Mark Bennett Peacock, barrister; John T. Atkinson, manager; Edward Blake Curlette, photographer; Fred E. Osborne, stationer; Robert A. Brown, electrical engineer; and Walter Stewart Davidson, barrister, all of the city of Calgary, in the Province of Alberta, and such other persons as may hereafter under the provisions of this Act become members of the said corporation, shall be and are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the name of "Al Azhar Temple Crippled Children's Hospital" for the purposes and objects hereinafter set out.

2. The special object for which this corporation is incorporated is to establish and operate a hospital for the care and treatment of underprivileged crippled children without charge to such children or their parents or guardians.

3. The said corporation shall have power to operate a hospital, dispensary, school and homes and working places for incurable or convalescent children, and to carry on such charitable activities in connection therewith as may be decided upon from time to time by the board of governors, and to impart education and physical, industrial, social and moral training.

4. The corporation shall have authority to use its funds for providing medicine, medical and surgical treatment, surgical appliances, apparatus and conveniences, clothing, provisions, maintenance, education, training, entertainment or transportation to such persons whether within or outside

any hospital actually operated or maintained by said corporation as may be decided upon from time to time by the board of governors.

5. The corporation shall have perpetual succession and a common seal, and may at all times hereafter contract and be contracted with, including the borrowing of money on mortgage or promissory note, sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded in any matter whatsoever in any courts and places whatsoever in this Province.

6. The corporation shall have power from time to time, and at all times hereafter to acquire by gift, devise, bequest, transfer, purchase or otherwise, for the benefit of the corporation, any land or seal or personal estate, and the same or any part thereof may from time to time dispose of by sale, transfer, mortgage, lease, exchange or otherwise, and with the proceeds therefrom may acquire other lands, tenements, hereditaments and other property real or personal, or invest the same in any security whatsoever for the uses of the corporation.

7. The members of the corporation shall be such persons as may be from time to time admitted to membership therein by the board of governors of the corporation.

8. Within three months after the final passing of this Act, a meeting of the members of the said corporation shall be held for the purpose of electing officers and for the transaction of such other business as is usually transacted at an organization meeting of a corporation, including the passing of by-laws for the government of the affairs of the corporation and the holding of an annual meeting.

9. The head office of the corporation shall be at the city of Calgary, in the Province of Alberta, or at such other place in the Province as may from time to time be determined by the by-laws of the corporation.

10. The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by a board of governors consisting of such number of the members of the corporation as shall be decided upon from time to time by the by-laws of the corporation.

11. The corporation shall have power to erect, construct, equip and maintain buildings and other erections for the proper carrying on of its hospital, educational and other works, and to do all other matters and things necessary, convenient or desirable for the carrying out of the objects of the corporation.

12. It shall be lawful for the corporation to make by-laws, rules and regulations for the government and proper administration of the property, affairs, interests, operations and activities of the corporation and to repeal or amend the same from time to time.

13. All revenues, assets and property of the corporation shall be applied for the furtherance of any or all of the objects for which the said corporation is incorporated.

14. Until otherwise directed by by-laws, the incorporators mentioned herein shall be the board of governors of the said corporation.

15. No member of the said corporation shall be liable individually to account for the debts, contracts or obligations of the corporation.

16. The corporation shall at all times when called upon so to do by the Lieutenant Governor in Council render an account in writing of its property and business affairs.

17. Provided that the powers herein granted shall be subject to the general laws of the Province now in force, or hereafter enacted.

18. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
