HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Creditors' Relief Act Amendment Act, 1932."
- **2.** The Creditors' Relief Act, being chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended as to section 41 thereof by adding thereto the following new subsection:
- "(2) The provisions of this Act shall not apply to the monies realized by execution issued for the purpose of enforcing any judgment or order for the payment of alimony."
