The amendment made by this Bill provides that when grain is sold and delivered at an elevator licensed under *The Canada Grain Act* to the manager thereof, the buyer acquires a good title to the grain provided he buys it in good faith and without notice of any defect or want of title on the part of the seller.

An Act to amend The Sale of Goods Act.

(Assented to , 1933.)

 \mathbf{H}^{IS} MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Sale of Goods Act Amendment Act, 1933."

2. The Sale of Goods Act, being chapter 146 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended by inserting therein, immediately after section 24 thereof, the following new section:
"24a. Where grain is sold and delivered at any elevator licensed under The Canada Grain Act, being chapter 5 of the Statutes of Canada, 1930, to the manager or operator thereof as defined in the said Act, the buyer acquires a good title to the grain so bought and delivered, provided he buys it in good faith and without actual knowledge of any defect or want of title on the part of the seller in the grain so sold and delivered."

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
