A BILL RESPECTING ADVANCES FOR SEED GRAIN,
FEED GRAIN AND FODDER IN THE YEARS
1933 AND 1934.

NOTE.

This Bill makes provision for advances for seed grain, feed grain and fodder between the first of September, 1933, and the first of June, 1934, and for securing the repayment of any advances so made by a charge on the recipient's crops grown in the years 1934 and 1935.

No. 19 of 1934.

An Act respecting Advances for Seed Grain, Feed Grain and Fodder in the Years 1933 and 1934.

(Assented to 1934.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Seed Grain, Feed Grain and Fodder Advances Act, 1934.*"

2. "Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture.

3. The Minister, with the consent of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, is hereby empowered to make advances by way of relief to farmers in necessitous circumstances for seed grain, feed grain and fodder at any time between the first day of September, 1933, and the first day of June, 1934.

4. Any sums advanced pursuant to this Act shall be a debt due to the Crown in the right of the Province and payment thereof may be enforced by suit brought by the Minister as the representative of the Crown as well as in the manner provided by this Act.

5. Every person, upon receiving any advance under this Act, shall sign in triplicate an agreement in the Form of Agreement in the schedule to this Act, and shall deliver two of the triplicate copies to the Minister.

6. The Minister shall from time to time cause a notice to be published in the *Alberta Gazette* of all persons who have received advances under this Act to the effect that the persons named therein have received such advances and setting out therein the names and post office addresses of the recipients.

7. Upon the publication of any such notice in *The Alberta Gazette* all grain crops grown upon any land in the Province of which the recipient is the owner during the years 1934 and 1935, and all grain crops grown in the Province in the said years in which the recipient has any interest shall stand charged with the repayment to the Crown of all sums advanced at any time before the publication of the notice and all further sums subsequently advanced to him together

with interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, and the said charge shall have the same priority as if the same were a valid charge created as security for the purchase price and interest thereon of necessities under section 32 of *The Bills of Sale Act* and shall rank *pari passu* therewith.

8. The Minister may by writing under his hand at any time after the thirty-first day of August, 1934, or before that date if he has reason to believe that for any reason whatsoever the security for the repayment of the advance is in jeopardy, authorize any person named therein to seize any grain crop which is subject to a charge pursuant to this Act and to sell so much thereof as may be necessary to satisfy the amount with which the crop is charged, together with such reasonable costs of seizure as may be from time to time prescribed by the Minister.

9. Subject only to such directions as may be given from time to time by the Minister, any person authorized by him to seize and sell any grain crop subject to any charge under this Act may sell any grain crop seized by him either by public auction or private contract at such price and at such time or times as he may in his discretion deem proper and shall not be accountable for any loss occasioned thereby.

10. The Minister shall cause to be kept in his department a record of all advances made under the authority of this Act and a file of all agreements entered into with respect thereto which shall be open to inspection by the public without fee at any time during ordinary office hours.

11. Any advances made pursuant to this Act shall be made out of the General Revenue Fund of the Province without any further or other appropriation than that made by this Act.

12. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to and upon so coming into force shall be deemed to have been in force at all times from and after the thirty-first day of August, 1933.
