A BILL TO AMEND THE DOMESTIC ANIMALS ACT
(MUNICIPALITIES).

NOTE.

The amendment made by this Bill restricts the right to impound estrays to cases where the stray is found on land surrounded by a fence.

The council of the municipal district is empowered to define what is a fence for the purposes of the Part of the Act dealing with estrays: and if there be no by-law, then the word "fence" is declared to be a lawful fence as defined in Part I of the Act.

An Act to amend The Domestic Animals Act
(Municipalities).

(Assented to _____, 1934.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Domestic Animals Act (Municipalities) Amendment Act, 1934.*"

2. *The Domestic Animals Act (Municipalities)*, being chapter 25 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1923, is hereby amended as to section 14 thereof—

- (a) by striking out the words "his premises," where the same occur therein, and by substituting therefor the words "any land so occupied by him which is surrounded by a fence";
- (b) by striking out the words "such premises," where the same occur therein, and by substituting therefor the words "that land"; and
- (c) by adding at the end thereof the following new subsections:
 - "(2) The council of every municipality may by by-law prescribe what shall be deemed to be a fence for the purpose of this Part of this Act.
 - "(3) In the absence of any by-law passed pursuant to this section prescribing what shall be deemed to be a fence for the purpose of this Part, the word "fence" used in this Part shall mean a lawful fence as defined in Part I of this Act."

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
