An Act to amend The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act.

 $\boldsymbol{H}^{\mathrm{IS}}$  MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act Amendment Act, 1934."

2. The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act, being chapter 25 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1932, is hereby amended as

25 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1932, is hereby amended as to section 2 thereof by inserting therein, immediately after paragraph (c) thereof, the following:
"(d) 'Alimony,' in addition to its ordinary meaning, includes any sum which is made payable to a wife for her maintenance and support by any order made where a judgment of divorce or nullity of marriage has been obtained."

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
