By this Bill the Lieutenant Governor in Council is empowered to fix the fees payable for licenses and for renewals and transfers at sums lesser than those fixed by the Act, and to differentiate between the fees payable having regard to the classification or location of the licensed business.

 $\boldsymbol{H}^{\mathrm{IS}}$ MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Restaurant Act Amendment Act, 1934.'

2. The Restaurant Act, being chapter 228 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended by striking out section 25 thereof and by substituting therefor the following:

"25.-(1) The fees payable upon the issuance, renewal or transfer of any license under this Act shall be of such amount not exceeding ten dollars in the case of restaurants in a city or town, and five dollars in the case of restaurants in any other place, as may from time to time be prescribed

"(2) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may classify restaurants according to any condition or circumstance as may be deemed proper and convenient and may prescribe different fees for different classes of restaurants and dif-ferent fees for restaurants of the same class in cities and in towns and in other places, and may exempt any specified class or classes of restaurant either in cities or in towns or in other places or wheresoever situate from the obligation to take out any license pursuant to this Act. "(3) Every order made pursuant to this section shall be published in *The Alberta Gazette* and shall take effect upon publication or such later date as may be fixed by the order for that purpose." different fees for different classes of restaurants and dif-

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
