A BILL TO AMEND THE RECIPROCAL ENFORCE-
MENT OF JUDGMENTS ACT.

NOTE.

This Bill extends the operation of the provisions of *The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act* to any foreign country: as that Act now stands it is confined in its operation to provinces and territories of the Dominion of Canada.

An Act to amend The Reciprocal Enforcement of
Judgments Act.

(Assented to _____, 1935.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of
the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta,
enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Reciprocal Enforcement
of Judgments Act Amendment Act, 1935.*"

2. *The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act*, being
chapter 5 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1925, is hereby amended
as to section 3 thereof by striking out the words "Dominion
of Canada," where the same occur in subsection (1) thereof,
and by substituting therefor the words "Dominion of Can-
ada, or in any foreign country."

3. The said Act is further amended as to section 9 thereof
by striking out subsection (1) thereof and by substituting
therefor the following:

"(1) Where the Lieutenant Governor is satisfied that
reciprocal provision has been or will be made by any foreign
country or by any other province or territory of the Domin-
ion of Canada for the enforcement within that foreign
country, province or territory of judgments obtained in the
Supreme or any District Court of this Province, he may
direct that this Act shall apply to that foreign country,
province or territory, and thereupon the Act shall apply
accordingly."

4. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which
it is assented to.
