

Bill No. 17 of 1935.

A BILL TO AMEND THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT.

NOTE.

This Bill empowers the Lieutenant Governor in Council to make regulations under *The Public Health Act* for the prevention, mitigation and suppression of disease in respect of fox ranches and fur farms additionally to the activities now set out in the Act.

It further empowers the making of regulations prohibiting the use of specified substances for disinfection except by persons authorized by the Board, and prescribing the method in which such substances may be used.

An Act to amend The Public Health Act.

(Assented to _____, 1935.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Public Health Act Amendment Act, 1935.*"

2. *The Public Health Act*, being chapter 58 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended as to section 7 thereof—

(a) by striking out the words "all piggeries," where the same occur in paragraph (h) of subsection (1) thereof, and by substituting therefor the words "all fox ranches, fur farms, piggeries"; and

(b) by adding at the end of subsection (1) thereof the following new paragraph:

"(qq) The prohibition of the use of any specified substance or substances, or of any of the derivatives of any such substances for the disinfection or disinfection of any building by any person who is not authorized by the Board to use the same; the authorization of persons to use the same; and the method in which the same may be used."

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
