HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Distress Act Amendment Act, 1935."
- 2. The Distress Act, being chapter 97 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended by inserting therein, immediately before section 5 thereof, the following
- new section:
 "4a. The following goods and chattels shall not be liable
- to seizure by a distress by a landlord for rent, namely: "(a) The beds, bedding and bedsteads (including perambulators or cradles) in ordinary use by the debtor and his family;

 "(b) The necessary and ordinary wearing apparel of the debtor and his family;

 - "(c) One cooking stove with pipes and furnishings, one other heating stove with pipes, two towels, one wash-basin, one kitchen table, one tea kettle, one teapot, one sauce-pan, one frying-pan and for each member of the family the following, namely: one chair, one cup and saucer, one plate, one knife, one
 - fork and one spoon;
 "(d) All necessary fuel, meat, fish, flour and vegetables for the ordinary consumption of the debtor and his family for thirty days;
 - "(e) The tools or agricultural implements used by the debtor in the practise of his trade or occupation to the value of three hundred dollars; and
 - "(f) One axe, one saw."
