A BILL TO AMEND THE BREAD ACT.

This Bill redefines "Minister" and makes every member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police on duty in the Province, and every member of the police force of every city, town and village, an *ex officio* inspector under the Act.

An Act to amend The Bread Act.

(Assented to _____, 1935.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Bread Act Amendment Act, 1935.*"

2. *The Bread Act*, being chapter 42 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1934, is hereby amended as to section 2 thereof by inserting therein, immediately after paragraph (f) thereof, the following new paragraph:

"(f1) 'Minister' means the member of the Executive Council for the time being charged with the administration of this Act."

3. The said Act is further amended by striking out the words "Minister of Health," wherever the same occur therein, and by substituting therefor the word "Minister".

4. The said Act is further amended as to section 19 thereof by striking out the same and by substituting therefor the following:

"**19.** Every member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police engaged upon police duty in the Province and every member of the police force of every city, town and village shall be *ex officio* an inspector under this Act, whose duty it shall be to enforce the provisions thereof and of all regulations made pursuant thereto".

5. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
