## Bill No. 7 of 1936.

### A BILL RESPECTING THE DEMISE OF THE CROWN.

#### NOTE.

This Bill provides that the holding of any office under the Crown in the right of the Province shall not be affected by the demise of the Crown.

It also provides that the right or capacity of any person to follow any profession or calling shall not be affected by the demise of the Crown.

It further provides that the taking of a further oath of allegiance or oath of office shall be unnecessary in respect of any such office, profession, calling or occupation.

An Act respecting the Demise of the Crown.

**H**IS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Demise of The Crown Act."
- 2.—(1) The holding of any office under the Crown in the right of the Province shall not be affected nor shall any fresh appointment thereto be necessary by the demise of the Crown.
- (2) The right or capacity of any person in the Province to practise, engage in or pursue any profession, occupation or calling shall not be affected by the demise of the Crown.
- (3) Upon the demise of the Crown it shall not be necessary for any person to again take any oath of allegiance or any oath of office in respect of any such office, profession, occupation or calling.
- ${\bf 3.}\,$  This Act shall take effect as and from the last demise of the Crown.
- $\boldsymbol{4.}$  This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
