# BILL

No. 15 of 1936.

An Act to amend The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act.

(Assented to

, 1936.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act Amendment Act, 1936."
- 2. The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act, being chapter 25 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1932, is hereby amended as to section 2 by striking out paragraph (d) thereof and by substituting therefore the following:

  "(d) 'Alimony', in addition to its ordinary meaning, includes any sum made payable in any case in which a judgment of divorce or nullity of marriage or judicial separation has been made to his wife or his former wife, as the case may be, for her maintenance and any sum so made payable for the maintenance of any child;".
- ${\bf 3.}$  This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
