NOTE.

Section 2 requires that the return as to arrears of taxes by a collecting school district shall show the years in which the arrears were levied.

Section 3 does away with a superfluous requirement.

Section 4 additionally empowers a municipality to sell or lease finally acquired property in lots.

An Act to amend The Tax Recovery Act, 1929.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Tax Recovery Act, 1929, Amendment Act, 1936."
- 2. The Tax Recovery Act, 1929, being chapter 39 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1929, is hereby amended as to section 3 thereof,—
 - (a) by striking out the words "the amount of all taxes then in arrear", where the same occur in subsection (1) thereof, and by substituting therefor the words "the amount of all the taxes then in arrear and the years in which such taxes were levied"; and
 - (b) by striking out the word "section", where the same occurs in subsection (4) thereof, and by substituting therefor the word "Act".
- 3. The said Act is further amended as to section 4 thereof by striking out the words "placing opposite the description of each parcel the amount of the arrears in respect thereof", where the same occur in subsection (1) thereof.
- 4. The said Act is further amended as to section 19 thereof by adding at the end thereof the following new subsection:

 "(2) Upon the final acquisition of a parcel the municipality may dispose of the same by sale or lease the same either in one parcel or, subject to the provisions of *The Public Works Act* and of *The Town Planning Act*, in two or more parcels or lots."
- ${\bf 5.}$ This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
