A BILL TO AMEND THE DOMESTIC ANIMALS (UN-
ORGANIZED TERRITORY) ACT.

NOTE.

The amendment made by this Bill redefines the expression "animal running at large" so as to include animals grazing on unfenced land without the consent of the person entitled to the immediate possession of the land.

An Act to amend The Domestic Animals (Unorganized Territory) Act.

(Assented to _____, 1936.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Domestic Animals (Unorganized Territory) Act Amendment Act, 1936.*"

2. *The Domestic Animals (Unorganized Territory) Act*, being chapter 67 of *The Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922*, is hereby amended as to section 2 by striking out paragraph (a) thereof and by substituting therefor the following:

"(a) 'Animal running at large' shall mean,—

"(i) an animal which is off the premises of its owner and is not under the immediate continuous and effective control of some person; or

"(ii) an animal which is not securely tethered or confined within any building or other enclosure or fence, whether the same be lawful or not; or

"(iii) an animal, whether in charge of a herder or not, which is for the time being grazing upon any unfenced land in any unorganized district without the consent of the person entitled to the immediate possession of the land;

"and 'run at large' shall have a meaning corresponding to 'running at large' in this Act;"

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
