HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

This Act may be cited as "The Unemployment Relief Act, 1933, Continuation Act, 1936."

2. The Unemployment Relief Act, 1933, being chapter 45 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1933, is hereby amended as to section 7 thereof by striking out the same and by substituting therefor the following:

"7.—(1) This Act shall expire on the thirty-first day of March, 1937.

"(2) Any obligation or liability incurred or created under the authority of this Act prior to the thirty-first day of March, 1936, may be paid and discharged out of the General Revenue Fund notwithstanding the expiration of the Act on the said date."

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
