# BILL

No. 11 of 1937.

An Act to amend The Dower Act.

**H**IS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

**1.** This Act may be cited as "*The Dower Act Amendment Act, 1937.*"

**2.** *The Dower Act*, being chapter 135 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended as to section 4 thereof, by striking out the words "intestate with respect to his homestead" where the same occur therein.

**3.** This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
