**H**IS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Dower Act Amendment Act, 1937."
- 2. The Dower Act, being chapter 135 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended as to section 4 thereof, by striking out the words "intestate with respect to his homestead" where the same occur therein.
- $\ensuremath{\mathbf{3.}}$  This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
