A BILL TO AMEND THE ALBERTA POLICE ACT.

NOTE.

This Bill confers upon municipal constables immunity from conviction for contraventions of *The Government Liquor Control Act of Alberta*, committed by any such constable whilst in the course of his duty, and for the purpose of obtaining evidence against suspected offenders against the said Act.

BILL

No. 26 of 1937.

An Act to amend The Alberta Police Act.

(Assented to _____, 1937.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Alberta Police Act Amendment Act, 1937.*"

2. *The Alberta Police Act* being chapter 82 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended as to section 19 by adding at the end thereof the following:

"(6) A municipal constable shall not be convicted of a violation of *The Government Liquor Control Act of Alberta*, if it is made to appear to the justice or magistrate before whom the complaint is heard that the municipal constable charged with any such offence committed the same in the course of his duty and for the purpose of obtaining evidence against persons who are suspected of contravening any of the provisions of the said Act."

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
