A BILL TO AMEND THE NOTARIES PUBLIC ACT.

This Bill restates the functions of a Notary Public in a manner which is designed to describe those functions in accordance with presently prevailing conditions.

An Act to amend The Notaries Public Act.

(Assented to _____, 1937.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Notaries Public Act Amendment Act, 1937.*"

2. *The Notaries Public Act*, being chapter 99 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended as to section 4 by striking out the same and by substituting therefor the following:

"**4.**—(1) Every notary shall have, use and exercise the power of administering oaths attested by his signature and seal, the power of attesting all commercial instruments brought before him for public protestation or otherwise, and the power of giving Notarial Certificates of his acts, and may demand, receive, and have all the rights, profits and emoluments rightfully appertaining to the exercise of such powers.

"(2) Where a notary administers oaths or takes affidavits, affirmations or declarations, within the Province for use within the Province, it shall not be necessary to their validity that he affix his seal thereto."

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
