A BILL TO AMEND THE JUDICATURE ACT.

NOTE.

The amendment made by this Bill makes every Clerk of the Court or Deputy Clerk of the Court who is appointed a Public Administrator, a corporation sole under the name of the Public Administrator for the judicial district or subjudicial district for which he is appointed.

The object of the amendment is to obviate the inconvenience which would arise in the event of the resignation or death of a Clerk or Deputy Clerk who had been so appointed.

An Act to amend The Judicature Act.

(Assented to , 1937.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Judicature Act Amendment Act, 1937."

2. The Judicature Act, being chapter 72 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended by inserting therein immediately after section 46 the following new section:

"46a. The Clerk of the Court or Deputy Clerk of the Court so appointed and each of his successors in office shall be a corporation sole under the name of the Public Administrator for the judicial district or sub-judicial district for which he is appointed and shall have a corporate seal and may under the name aforesaid from time to time, buy, acquire, transfer, or otherwise hold, possess, enjoy, take and receive any land, or any real or personal estate, or any interest therein, and may from time to time, in his corporate name, sell, transfer, mortgage, lease, exchange, or otherwise dispose thereof."

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
