An Act to amend The Feeder Associations
Guarantee Act.

(Assented to , 1937.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Feeder Associations Guarantee Act Amendment Act, 1937.*"

2. *The Feeder Associations Guarantee Act*, being an Act enacted at the present session of the Legislative Assembly, is hereby amended as to section 2 thereof, by striking out the words "by utilizing surplus feed and fodder" where the same occur in paragraph (a).

3. The said Act is further amended as to section 3 thereof by striking out the same and by substituting therefor the following:

"**3.**—(1) Upon the recommendation of the Minister of Agriculture, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may from time to time, authorize and empower the Provincial Treasurer to guarantee on behalf of the Province, the due repayment of any losses which may be sustained by any person as a result of loans made by any such person for the purpose of assisting any Feeder Association to acquire live stock for fattening and finishing by the members thereof, provided however, that in no case shall the liability of the Government of the Province of Alberta in respect of guarantees given under this Act to any person, exceed twenty-five per cent of the aggregate amount of any such loans, and every such guarantee shall be in such form and upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

"(2) The aggregate amount of the borrowings of any Feeder Association in respect of which a guarantee may be given pursuant to this Act in any year, shall not exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars."

4. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
