A BILL TO AMEND THE GAME ACT, 1932.

NOTE.

The section proposed to be repealed by this Bill reads as follows:

"15. No person shall at any time destroy, partially destroy, open, leave open or place any trap in the house or push-up of any muskrat or beaver, unless authorized so to do by the regulations relating to fur-farming, and in accordance therewith."

The section which this Bill proposes to substitute for the section above quoted makes lawful the placing of traps in any house or push-up of muskrats, but prohibits the destruction, opening or placing of traps in the house of any beaver, or the runway or den of any muskrat, unless authorized so to do by the regulations made pursuant to section 37 of the Act.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Asembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Game Act, 1932, Amendment Act, 1937."
- 2. The Game Act, 1932, being chapter 27 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1932, is hereby amended as to section 15 by striking out the same and by substituting therefor the following:
- "15. No person shall at any time destroy, partially destroy, open, leave open, or place any trap in the house of any beaver, or the runway or den of any muskrat, unless authorized so to do by the regulations, and in accordance therewith."
- ${\bf 3.}$ This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
