# Bill No. 26 of 1938.

### A BILL TO AMEND THE PUBLIC WORKS ACT.

### NOTE.

The amendment made by this Bill empowers the Minister of Public Works and his agents to erect snow fences on any land contiguous to any highway; no rent or other compensation is payable to any person in respect thereof; and any snow fences so erected are declared to be public works for the purposes of *The Public Works Act*.

# BILL

No. 26 of 1938.

An Act to amend The Public Works Act.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1938."
- 2. The Public Works Act, being chapter 44 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended by inserting therein immediately after section 15 the following new section:
- "15a.—(1) The Minister may by his engineers, agents, workmen or servants, at any time and from time to time, enter into and upon and occupy any land which is contiguous to any highway and may erect upon any such land snow fences for the purpose of preventing such highway from becoming blocked by snow-drifts and may from time to time enter upon such land for the purpose of maintaining, repairing, removing or replacing any such snow fence.
- (2) No person shall be entitled to any rent or any other compensation whatsoever in respect of any entry or occupation effected under this section.
- (3) Every snow fence erected pursuant to this section shall be a public work for all the purposes of this Act.
- ${\bf 3.}$  This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
