A BILL TO AMEND THE DRAINAGE DISTRICTS ACT.

**NOTE.**

The amendment made by this Bill places upon the municipality the duty of maintaining bridges constructed, enlarged or improved at the joint cost of the municipality and a drainage district and provides that the cost of maintenance shall be apportioned between the municipality and the drainage district in the same proportion as the original cost of construction, enlargement or improvement was apportioned.

# BILL

No. 30 of 1938.

An Act to amend The Drainage Districts Act.

(Assented to \_\_\_\_\_, 1938.)

**H**IS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

**1.** This Act may be cited as "*The Drainage Districts Act Amendment Act, 1938.*"

**2.** *The Drainage Districts Act*, being chapter 46 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended as to section 120 by striking out subsection (5) thereof and by substituting therefor the following:

"(5) It shall be the duty of the municipality in which any such bridge is situate, to maintain the same, and the cost of such maintenance shall be apportioned between the municipality and the district respectively in the same proportion as the original cost of construction, enlargement or improvement thereof was apportioned between the municipality and the district, and the sum attributable to any district under such apportionment shall constitute a debt due from the district to the municipality."

**3.** This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
