HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act Amendment Act, 1939."

2. The Alimony Orders Enforcement Act, being chapter 25 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1932, is hereby amended as to section 3 by striking out the words "the disposal he has made of any property since the order was made" where the same occur in subsection (1) and by substituting therefor the words "the disposal he has made of any property since the date upon which the proceedings were commenced in which the order was made".

 ${\bf 3.}$ This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
